

Reading for Joy, People for Education, 2011



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
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

 - Provides equitable access to 800 Internet links, a variety of online databases and a growing library of electronic reference books
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- 2. Passwords bookmark
 - Used to access password-protected library website content remotely

- Online Resources @ Your School Library
 Supports students, teachers, administrators and parents to use quality online resources at home and school
- Student Success @ Your School Library
 Supports students, teachers, administrators and parents to understand the role of school libraries
- Developing School Library Collections
 Supports communities to understand how quality school library collections are developed and maintained

- 4. Procedure 531: Selection and Approval of Learning Resources
 - Library resource materials will be selected and approved by using the same criteria that are applied to the selection and approval of supplementary learning resources for classroom use:
 - Appropriateness to program
 - Suitability for students
 - Nature and degree of bias
 - Canadian content
 - Quality of visual and physical format
 - Cost and durability
 - Internet resources are considered supplementary resources

- Standards for Information and Communications Technology (ICT)
 - "...it [is] essential for students to become computer literate and to develop information literacy skills."
 - Provide a road map for students, teachers, and administrators, on what students will achieve
 - Provide consistent student achievement of these skills throughout the TDSB
 - Teachers will apply the ICT standards within all subject curricula, as ICT skills are best learned within the context of subject applications

 - "To provide direction to staff and students on the issues of academic honesty, including cheating and plagiarism"

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
